There are primarily two voices in English grammar - Active Voice and Passive Voice. These voices determine whether the subject performs the action or is being acted upon. Both active and passive voices are essential components of the English language. Active Voices refer to sentences where the subject performs the action indicated by the verb, making it the doer of the action. This form of voice is typically more concise and direct compared to passive voice sentences, considered easier to read. Example: The dog chased the ball. On the other hand, Passive Voice sentences are formed using the verb "to be" followed by the past participle of the main verb. In this type of voice, the subject receives the action, making it the receiver of the action. Example: The class was taught by the teacher. Active voice has the subject doing the action, while passive voice has the subject receiving the action. When choosing between the two, active voice is better when you want to focus on who's doing something. It's clearer and more direct. Passive voice might be used if you're highlighting what's being done or if the person doing it isn't important. Changing a sentence from passive to active involves moving the subject to the doer position and adjusting the verb accordingly. This can help make your writing more engaging. In scientific texts, passive voice is often preferred for creating an objective tone. It's also commonly used in historical accounts or when describing completed actions. Different tenses have varying levels of usage, but it's worth noting that passive voice is more frequent in past tense descriptions.
