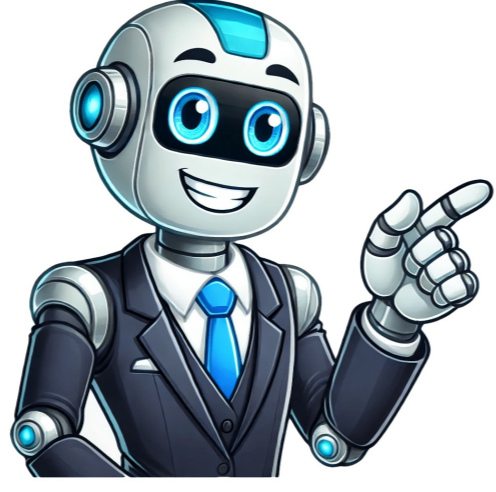

Changing hair colors is as fun as changing your wardrobe, and, when buying clothes, people often like to mix and match according to what would look best together. Choosing the right hair color for your skin tone is similar to choosing the perfect wardrobe colors for your locks. Well, that hat is your hair and it's a hat you wear every day," renowned stylist George Brescia wrote in his book,Change Your Clothes, Change Your Life (via Livingly).When you get a fresh dye job, your clothes in your closet may or may not look good with your new hair color. But, fret not. Choosing the right wardrobe colors for your tresses can be a walk in the park if you follow some tips. Blondes can rock bright and warm colors. Any shades of blue and bold colors like red look especially striking on platinum blondes. For honey blondes, blue, green, red, purple, and yellow hues with high color saturation will look great on them (via She Knows). Furthermore, fair-haired women can also rock shades of pink and orange. When it comes to blondes in black, the dark color may look too harsh for people with a lighter complexion. If you prefer dark shades, go for navy blue. "It acts as a black without being a black, creating a subdued palette that is one important degree warmer," stylist and author, George Brescia, shares (via Livingly).He also explains that not all patterns look great on blondes. Bold patterns are a no-no for light-colored women, as the graphic patterns can overwhelm their features. Another color to consider is light brown (camel). Brescia further notes that the earth tone can bring out the highlights of your golden locks, and it can put "you at center stage" (via Livingly). Brunettes can rock rich colors. Shades of red (both bright and dark) can also look good with your hair color, as well as blue, black, and white. Like blondes, jewel colors can also look great on you. For hair with warm tones of brown, you may want to try out some green shades such as olive, orange-red, and a dark shade of purple. As for brunettes with cool tones, gray, dark blue, and brown will look stunning with your hair color (via She Knows).Brown-haired women can enjoy wearing printed patterns, as they can make your features stand out. Pastel colors and beige can make you look washed-out, but neons can look fabulous on you (via Bright Side). "Your shock of dark hair makes a powerful statement," stylist George Brescia said. The dark locks can "stand up to bright colors." He also urges brunettes to embrace their "ability to wear attention-getting hues that would be overpowering for other women" (via Livingly). The bright, rich locks of a redhead are already a statement on their own. Mixing with different kinds of wardrobe colors may not be ideal since their hair color is not neutral. Picking out colors of clothes can be more challenging for redheads, unlike women with other hair colors. Shades of colors are another thing to consider. Stylist George Brescia recommends specific colors for the standout tresses, like blondes, redheads can wear navy blue clothes instead of black. The dark color can wash out the pale skin of redheads (via Livingly).Green is also an excellent choice for redheads and probably the most flattering color for them. The hues of the earth tone lie on opposite ends of the spectrum and thus present the strongest possible contrast when juxtaposed," Brescia explains. Coral and camel colors will also look fabulous with red hair. However, stay away from pastels, as they can be unflattering for your locks (via Bright Side). Black-haired women can wear the fail-proof black color. In addition, white, green, purple, blue, and clothes with patterns will look amazing with your dark locks. Low-saturated colors, such as taupe and mauve, may not look ideal with your tresses. Although light pastels will look great and can be a nice contrast to your hair (via Bright Side).As for women with platinum or gray hair, Sandy Dumont, an image consultant, recommends wearing clothes with jewel tones such as ruby red, sapphire blue, purple, magenta, and fuchsia. She also advises choosing white, black, and navy blue as they're neutral colors. Dumont also notes avoiding specific colors that are unflattering for ladies with gray hair. "Avoid going matchy-matchy with gray clothing, as it can age you. Greens can also be tricky, as they can actually make your hair look sapphire blue when you're standing in the sunlight" (via Revolution Gray). Finding your Skin UndertoneAn undertone is the complexion of your skin, and most people fall between one of three categories: Cool, Warm and Neutral. By understanding what your undertone is, it can help you discover the best shades of color to wear. Color Check:Look for specific colors that stand out in your skin. Warm-toned skin has yellow, peach and gold tint, while cool-toned skin has more pink, red or blue.Look at Your Wrist:Look at your veins. If you see blue or purple veins, youre most likely cool-toned, and if you see green, youre warm.Look at your Eyes:Does their eye have golden flecks? Their color will look better with something warmer. Does their eyes have blue or grey flecks? Then I will probably suggest something cooler, saysQuinlan. Generally, cool toned people have blue, gray or green eyes, and warm toned people have brown, hazel or amber eyes.Look at your Hair: Look at your natural hair/curl tones will have silver or ash undertones and warm tones will have red, orange or yellow undertones.Celebrity Match:Look for a celebrity who has similar skin tone to you and see if you both have cool or warm tones. You can also see how a hair color, or a color looks on them, and if you like it.Now, what if you dont identify with any of those or feel in the middle? Youre probably a neutral skin tone, which means you can wear either cool or warm tonesto, you! Some general color guidelines based on your skin undertone are:Warm undertones look better in gold jewelry, whereas, cool undertones look great in silver jewelry.Generally, warmer skin tones look flattering in warmer colors (like red, orange and yellow) and cool skin tones look flattering in cooler colors (like blue, green, purple).Look for colors with the same undertone!youre cool toned, find a red with a blue-ish / deeper base, and if youre warm toned, look for warmer brick reds.Very Fair:Opt images Best hair colors include: Platinum, icy/ash blonde, red, ashy blonde, champagne, gold, honeyBest colors to wear: Neutrals, pastels, jewel tones Something too dark or light (in hair or clothing) can sometimes feel harsh for everyday, says Quinlan. I tend to advise my clients to stay away from those extremes unless they are really going for more of a look. You can add subtle contrast with darker neutral colors and jewel tones. When deciding on clothing colors, consider your style preferences, skin tone and even your hair color. Best clothing colors for blondes Blondes generally look best in bright, warm colors. Consider yellow, orange and rust, as well as neutrals such as cream, taupe and crisp white. Platinum blondes look stunning in true red as well as any shade of blue. Jewel tones flatter warm, honey blondes, as do colors with red undertones. For light brunettes, saturated shades of coral rather than pastels are your best bet. They have the strongest contrast between them.Because complementary colors have such a strong contrast, they are the boldest combination you can make, which can create a color clash if you combine two at too high an intensity. The best way to combine complementary colors is to contrast their brightness. These colors look best together when one is darker or lighter or more muted than the other.Split complementary is the close cousin of complementary color combos. This is when you combine one color with the color next to its opposite on the wheel, which creates a contrast thats a bit less intense. Triad colors are a combination of three colors equally distant from each other on the color wheel. Contrary to common perception though, you dont have to wear all three colors for this combination to work. You can pick two colors from a triad and wear them together.In fact, beginners should stick to combining two triadic colors rather than attempting to wear all three, as its more difficult to pull off and requires a trained eye.For triad combos as well, make sure to apply some contrast in intensity. They work best when one color is lighter or darker than the other. You can also combine colors that all belong to the same hue, but differ in intensity. This creates a monochromatic outfit. For example, pairing light blue with dark blue, or a muted green with light green.Psst... Some of the best colors to combine in your outfit are not colors at all. They are called neutrals.Neutral colors like white, gray, and black go with just about everything, because they are achromatic. In the world of fashion, navy, brown and khaki (and sometimes olive and light blue) are considered neutrals as well, because they also tend to blend with other colors well.White all neutrals come with some caveats, as well cover rather than, you can use them to create easy combinations with other colors. Red looks great when paired with neutrals like white, black, gray or navy, which make the bold color pop. It also looks great with earthy browns or with contrasting colors like yellow and green, as long as you contrast the intensity as well. Mustard yellow, army green and light blue make particularly fetching color combos for red.Check out my full article on what colors go with red clothes for more outfit ideas. Green is not a common color in a mans wardrobe, but can look great, especially when you choose dark green or olive tones, which look quite flattering on a man.The easiest combinations for green are white and black, as you can hardly go wrong with those. Green combined with earthy browns creates a look that reminds of nature, and beige looks particularly good with green. Blue and yellow also pair well as its analogous colors, and complementary pink makes a fantastic accent color when paired with dark green.(Check out my article on what to wear with green pants for more outfit ideas.) Yellow is a color not frequently worn by men. Its a vibrant color that looks overwhelming on a man when worn in large quantities. It can also make your skin look washed out if youre not wearing the right kind of yellow, especially when you already have a pale skin tone. For these reasons, most men avoid it altogether.You can make great color combinations with yellow though. It tends to serve best as an accent color used for accessories. Of course, if youre bold enough, you can opt for a yellow T-shirt, polo, shorts or even pants. Youll certainly make a statement. When doing so though, opt for neutral colors like white, brown, black or navy for the rest of your outfit.Yellow pairs well with green and blue, and works great as an accent color to red or purple clothes (though not many men wear purple either). Navy clothes combine well with white, light and light brown colors like beige or camel. These colors provide an eye-pleasing contrast with the dark hue of navy. Pink, red and orange make fantastic complements to navy clothes and are great colors to use as accents in accessories. (The navy suit with a crisp white shirt and red tie will never go out of style.) Pairing the dark blue with lighter tints of blue creates a soft monochromatic look thats always a safe bet for men.Navy is considered neutral because it pairs well with most colors, but the matches above are especially eye-pleasing. When wearing navy clothes, you shouldnt wear black in large quantities, though. Burgundy is an underused color in menswear, but it pairs well with neutrals like white, gray, and light brown. It can look great when combined with light blues or with yellow accents, which both pop against the darker shade of red. Despite its inherent darkness, it also pairs surprisingly well with navy. Orange is a color you dont see often in menswear, because its not the easiest color to pair, and like yellow, doesnt look great on everyone. With that said, men often envision orange at its most vibrant hue and forget that even for orange, they can choose from a spectrum of shades. Rust orange looks great against paler skin-types, while coral can look amazing with darker skin.Orange pairs extremely well with gray, brown, black and white. You might also wear it as an accent piece with navy, dark red or blue greens, or for the bolder gents, with blue-violet or navy. Beige is a neutral color that goes with any other color. It pairs well with other shades of brown, and looks great with green and blue. Beige is an excellent color to wear in summer when you combine it with white or other light hues like mint green or sky blue. If youre looking to create more contrast, beige also makes a great combo with navy, maroon or darker browns. Many men still avoid wearing pink because of its reputation as a feminine color, but it can look amazing in perfectly masculine outfits. A pink shirt looks great with a navy suit or with jeans, for example. Just start with a subtle light pink shirt, if you want to wet your toes with this color first.Light pink is easy to pair with other neutrals, like navy, black, white, beige and gray, and looks great when paired with dark green. The bolder individuals may combine a hot pink with blue violets or yellow greens. Whether its jeans, suits, sports coats or T-shirts, we tend to gravitate toward blue. Its an effortless color to wear. But what colors go well with blue?You can wear blue with white, black and gray. It reminds of seas and beaches when paired with brown and makes easy pairing with analogous colors like cyan, turquoise or green. Lastly, it provides fetching contrasts with yellow, brown, red and orange. You almost cant go wrong with blue, but there are a few exceptions you should keep in mind when putting your outfit together. If you pair black with other colors that are almost as dark as black itself, it creates an off-putting, muddy appearance.If you wear black clothes with other black clothes, you must make sure they are the exact same shade, as otherwise, one garment will look washed out. For the same reason, you should avoid wearing greys that look almost black. Otherwise, black goes with any other color, but looks especially good when contrasted against light or bold, vibrant colors. The only color you should avoid wearing with white is off-white, but otherwise, white goes with all colors meaning, it goes with all hues, all tints and all tones. This is why white is the ultimate neutral and should have a prominent place in your wardrobe. Gray clothes, whether theyre light gray or dark gray, pair the best with lighter or brighter colors. Gray makes colors stand out against it, making it the ultimate support color. Whether its red, green, blue or orange, gray makes all these colors pop. Avoid combining gray with other muted colors as it creates too muddy of an appearance. Brown is a safe color that can go with just about any other color, but goes especially well with white, blue and green. For a more daring look, you might wear brown with orange or yellow which both look fantastic against brown. You can also wear different shades of brown, as it creates a pleasant earthy appearance. "It acts as a black without being a black, creating a subdued palette that is one important degree warmer," stylist and author, George Brescia, shares (via Livingly).He also explains that not all patterns look great on blondes. Bold patterns are a no-no for light-colored women, as the graphic patterns can overwhelm their features. Another color to consider is light brown (camel). Brescia further notes that the earth tone can bring out the highlights of your golden locks, and it can put "you at center stage" (via Livingly). Brunettes can rock rich colors. Shades of red (both bright and dark) can also look good with your hair color, as well as blue, black, and white. Like blondes, jewel colors can also look great on you. For hair with warm tones of brown, you may want to try out some green shades such as olive, orange-red, and a dark shade of purple. The hues of the earth tone lie on opposite ends of the spectrum and thus present the strongest possible contrast when juxtaposed," Brescia explains. Coral and camel colors will also look fabulous with red hair. However, stay away from pastels, as they can be unflattering for your locks (via Bright Side). Warm-toned skin has yellow, peach and gold tint, while cool-toned skin has more pink, red or blue.Look at Your Wrist:Look at your veins. If you see blue or purple veins, youre most likely cool-toned, and if you see green, youre warm.Look at your Eyes:Does their eye have golden flecks? Their color will look better with something warmer. Does their eyes have blue or grey flecks? Then I will probably suggest something cooler, saysQuinlan. Generally, cool toned people have blue, gray or green eyes, and warm toned people have brown, hazel or amber eyes.Look at your Hair: Look at your natural hair/curl tones will have silver or ash undertones and warm tones will have red, orange or yellow undertones.Celebrity Match:Look for a celebrity who has similar skin tone to you and see if you both have cool or warm tones. You can also see how a hair color, or a color looks on them, and if you like it.Now, what if you dont identify with any of those or feel in the middle? Youre probably a neutral skin tone, which means you can wear either cool or warm tonesto, you! Some general color guidelines based on your skin undertone are:Warm undertones look better in gold jewelry, whereas, cool undertones look great in silver jewelry.Generally, warmer skin tones look flattering in warmer colors (like red, orange and yellow) and cool skin tones look flattering in cooler colors (like blue, green, purple).Look for colors with the same undertone!youre cool toned, find a red with a blue-ish / deeper base, and if youre warm toned, look for warmer brick reds.Very Fair:Opt images Best hair colors include: Platinum, icy/ash blonde, red, ashy blonde, champagne, gold, honeyBest colors to wear: Neutrals, pastels, jewel tones Something too dark or light (in hair or clothing) can sometimes feel harsh for everyday, says Quinlan. They have the strongest contrast between them.Because complementary colors have such a strong contrast, they are the boldest combination you can make, which can create a color clash if you combine two at too high an intensity. The best way to combine complementary colors is to contrast their brightness. These colors look best together when one is darker or lighter or more muted than the other.Split complementary is the close cousin of complementary color combos. This is when you combine one color with the color next to its opposite on the wheel, which creates a contrast thats a bit less intense. Triad colors are a combination of three colors equally distant from each other on the color wheel. Contrary to common perception though, you dont have to wear all three colors for this combination to work. You can pick two colors from a triad and wear them together.In fact, beginners should stick to combining two triadic colors rather than attempting to wear all three, as its more difficult to pull off and requires a trained eye.For triad combos as well, make sure to apply some contrast in intensity. They work best when one color is lighter or darker than the other. You can also combine colors that all belong to the same hue, but differ in intensity. This creates a monochromatic outfit. For example, pairing light blue with dark blue, or a muted green with light green.Psst... Some of the best colors to combine in your outfit are not colors at all. They are called neutrals.Neutral colors like white, gray, and black go with just about everything, because they are achromatic. In the world of fashion, navy, brown and khaki (and sometimes olive and light blue) are considered neutrals as well, because they also tend to blend with other colors well.White all neutrals come with some caveats, as well cover rather than, you can use them to create easy combinations with other colors. Red looks great when paired with neutrals like white, black, gray or navy, which make the bold color pop. It also looks great with earthy browns or with contrasting colors like yellow and green, as long as you contrast the intensity as well. Mustard yellow, army green and light blue make particularly fetching color combos for red.Check out my full article on what colors go with red clothes for more outfit ideas. Green is not a common color in a mans wardrobe, but can look great, especially when you choose dark green or olive tones, which look quite flattering on a man.The easiest combinations for green are white and black, as you can hardly go wrong with those. Green combined with earthy browns creates a look that reminds of nature, and beige looks particularly good with green. Blue and yellow also pair well as its analogous colors, and complementary pink makes a fantastic accent color when paired with dark green.(Check out my article on what to wear with green pants for more outfit ideas.) Yellow is a color not frequently worn by men. Its a vibrant color that looks overwhelming on a man when worn in large quantities. It can also make your skin look washed out if youre not wearing the right kind of yellow, especially when you already have a pale skin tone. For these reasons, most men avoid it altogether.You can make great color combinations with yellow though. It tends to serve best as an accent color used for accessories. Of course, if youre bold enough, you can opt for a yellow T-shirt, polo, shorts or even pants. Youll certainly make a statement. When doing so though, opt for neutral colors like white, brown, black or navy for the rest of your outfit.Yellow pairs well with green and blue, and works great as an accent color to red or purple clothes (though not many men wear purple either). Navy clothes combine well with white, light and light brown colors like beige or camel. These colors provide an eye-pleasing contrast with the dark hue of navy. Pink, red and orange make fantastic complements to navy clothes and are great colors to use as accents in accessories. (The navy suit with a crisp white shirt and red tie will never go out of style.) Pairing the dark blue with lighter tints of blue creates a soft monochromatic look thats always a safe bet for men.Navy is considered neutral because it pairs well with most colors, but the matches above are especially eye-pleasing. When wearing navy clothes, you shouldnt wear black in large quantities, though. Burgundy is an underused color in menswear, but it pairs well with neutrals like white, gray, and light brown. It can look great when combined with light blues or with yellow accents, which both pop against the darker shade of red. Despite its inherent darkness, it also pairs surprisingly well with navy. Orange is a color you dont see often in menswear, because its not the easiest color to pair, and like yellow, doesnt look great on everyone. With that said, men often envision orange at its most vibrant hue and forget that even for orange, they can choose from a spectrum of shades. Rust orange looks great against paler skin-types, while coral can look amazing with darker skin.Orange pairs extremely well with gray, brown, black and white. You might also wear it as an accent piece with navy, dark red or blue greens, or for the bolder gents, with blue-violet or navy. Beige is a neutral color that goes with any other color. It pairs well with other shades of brown, and looks great with green and blue. Beige is an excellent color to wear in summer when you combine it with white or other light hues like mint green or sky blue. If youre looking to create more contrast, beige also makes a great combo with navy, maroon or darker browns. Many men still avoid wearing pink because of its reputation as a feminine color, but it can look amazing in perfectly masculine outfits. A pink shirt looks great with a navy suit or with jeans, for example. Just start with a subtle light pink shirt, if you want to wet your toes with this color first.Light pink is easy to pair with other neutrals, like navy, black, white, beige and gray, and looks great when paired with dark green. The bolder individuals may combine a hot pink with blue violets or yellow greens. Blue is the quintessential color when it comes to menswear, as i guarantee everyone reading this has plenty of blue in their wardrobe already. Whether its jeans, suits, sports coats or T-shirts, we tend to gravitate toward blue. Its an effortless color to wear. But what colors go well with blue?You can wear blue with white, black and gray. It reminds of seas and beaches when paired with brown and makes easy pairing with analogous colors like cyan, turquoise or green. Lastly, it provides fetching contrasts with yellow, brown, red and orange. You almost cant go wrong with blue, but there are a few exceptions you should keep in mind when putting your outfit together. If you pair black with other colors that are almost as dark as black itself, it creates an off-putting, muddy appearance.If you wear black clothes with other black clothes, you must make sure they are the exact same shade, as otherwise, one garment will look washed out. For the same reason, you should avoid wearing greys that look almost black. Otherwise, black goes with any other color, but looks especially good when contrasted against light or bold, vibrant colors. The only color you should avoid wearing with white is off-white, but otherwise,
