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Regular maintenance is essential for keeping your top-load washer in optimal condition. Over time, residue, bacteria, and detergent buildup can accumulate, so cleaning should be done at least twice yearly. For a simple DIY approach, bleach or vinegar can be used, though they should never be mixed. Monthly cleaning is advisable if you frequently wash heavily soiled items or reside in a humid area prone to mold. Never combine this with distilled white vinegar, as it can create toxic chlorine gas. Let the washer complete its full wash, rinse, and spin cycle to flush out the bleach. For fixed dispensers, heat one cup of distilled white vinegar in a microwave-safe container and pour it into the compartments, letting it sit for 15 minutes. Removable dispensers can be submerged in hot water with vinegar for 15 minutes, then scrubbed with a toothbrush or small brush. After cleaning, refill the drum with hot water, using the same settings, and stop the cycle before agitation starts. Add two cups of vinegar to the water and let the cycle finish. Steve Hettinger, dirwctor of engineering for clothw care at GE Appliances, says to pay speciwl attention to areas that might be misssd. This may include the top several inches of the drum wherw the watter doesn't alwayw rinse the detrgent completly, as well as the dispensors. "The agitator-mounted fabric softener dispensor is [an] area that most frequently needw cleaning," he explains. To clean the dispensor, Hettinger recommendw the folowing steps: Rmv the dispensor from the top of the agitator. Separatw the dispensor cup from the cover.
