In most cases, boat operators in Hawaii need to obtain a boating license to operate their vessels legally on water. The Division of Boating and Ocean Recreation (DOBOR) requires proof of completion of a state-approved safety course as part of the licensing process. However, a boating license is not issued directly - instead, operators must carry a boat certification with them when operating certain boats. Boat certification is necessary for power-driven vessels over 10 horsepower or vessels propelled by wind or sail with an auxiliary engine. The certificate serves as an alternate document that individuals may use in cases where the state does not issue standard boat licenses. To operate a boat, boaters must complete a state-approved safety course or a NASBLA-approved course. However, younger operators under 16 years of age require additional supervision by someone over 21 with a valid certificate to ensure their safety on the water. Residents in Hawaii's four counties must satisfy specific requirements before applying for a boating certification. This typically involves completing a state-approved boating school and passing a mandatory test. It is essential for young motorists to note that obtaining a personal certificate will not automatically qualify them for operating boats or vessels without adult supervision. In Hawaii, boaters must complete a National Association of State Boating Law Administrators (NASBLA) or state-approved course to operate a boat. Around 85 percent of the content is standardized by NASBLA, while 15 percent is specific to each state's registration rules and regulations. The Hawaii Department of Boat Registration (HI DOBOR) offers various methods for taking a boater safety course, including internet-based, home study, and classroom courses. Regardless of the method taken, all boaters will need to obtain a course approval stamp to operate a boat. Additionally, they may request a state-issued laminated Boater Safety Education Card (BSEC), which is proof of compliance. Boaters who have completed a NASBLA-approved course in another state with mandatory education requirements may be able to cite reciprocity and receive a state-approved BSEC by sending documentation to the Honolulu office. However, boaters who enroll in a Windward Community College (WCC) thrill craft certification class cannot operate a boat unless the NASBLA approval of their boating course is met. When renewing a Hawaii Boater Safety Education Card, boaters must also renew their Marina Service Certificate of Management (MMC). The expiration date of both documents is tied to each other. To learn more about renewing certifications, individuals should contact the DOBOR directly. Furthermore, if a boat license certificate is lost or not received, boaters can reach out to the course provider for technical support. A Hawaii boat registration is a required procedure for undocumented vessels through the HI Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR). Not all vessels require registration, but those that do must display their unique registration number on both sides of the hull. When obtaining a DMV boat registration, boaters must provide proof of ownership to register or transfer the vessel. Hawaii's boating regulations require boaters to carry a safety boater course certificate of completion while operating a boat or vessel. Failure to provide this documentation may result in a violation and a court appearance. To inquire more information about HI boating rules, contact the DOBOR. Lastly, boaters who are unable to print their certificates will be required to pay a \$20 fee for a copy of the certificate to be sent to their addresses.
