The second season of HBO's post-apocalyptic drama "The Last of Us" is underway. Fans eagerly await its premiere on April 13th at 9/8c on HBO and Max. Unlike the first season, which had nine episodes, Season 2 will only have seven installments. Filming has been completed as of August 2024. The Last of Us Season 2 to Air on HBO and Max HBO has renewed its hit post-apocalyptic series "The Last of Us" for a second season. The show, which premiered last year, was developed by Neil Druckmann and Craig Mazin, and stars Pedro Pascal and Bella Ramsey as Joel and Ellie. The first season followed the hardened smuggler Joel's attempt to transport young Ellie across the post-apocalyptic United States in search of a cure for the fungal infection that has devastated the world. HBO's head of Drama Series and Films Francesca Orsi announced that the show had been renewed after its creators "defined a genre with their masterful debut season." The renewal comes as no surprise, given the show's massive success. The premiere episode drew 4.7M viewers on HBO Max, making it one of the largest debuts on the platform. Druckmann expressed his gratitude to Neil Druckmann and HBO for the partnership, while Mazin said he was "honored" that so many people had connected with their retelling of Joel and Ellie's journey. Dina, played by Isabella Merced, is set to join HBO's cast in season 2, alongside Kaitlyn Dever, who will play Abby. In an interview, Merced revealed that Dever required extra security due to overzealous fans, saying "there are so many strange people" who genuinely hate Abby. Showrunner Craig Mazin explained the casting process for season 2, stating they look for world-class actors who embody the characters' souls in the source material. Kaitlyn Dever joins Pedro, Bella, and others in the cast, while Young Mazino plays Jesse, a pillar of his community who prioritizes others at times. Catherine O'Hara is set to guest star in an undisclosed role, and HBO confirmed that season 2 will have seven episodes, compared to nine in season 1. The first teaser for season 2 was released in January 2025, showcasing action-packed clips and giving fans a glimpse of Dever's Abby. A full trailer has yet to be released, but fans can expect it approximately one month before the premiere. The Last of Us season 2 will premiere on April 13, 2025, at 9 p.m. ET, with episodes also available to stream on Max. Showrunners Craig Mazin and Neil Druckmann clarified that The Last of Us is not a series intended for multiple seasons, with the remaining story from Part II expected to take more than a season to tell. HBO's "The Last of Us" season 2 will have seven episodes and be based on the sequel to the 2013 video game, "The Last of Us Part II". Showrunner Craig Mazin explained that the abundance of material from the game means they're taking their time to tell the story across seasons. They've identified natural breakpoints, with season 2 ending after seven episodes. The show's creators are hopeful for a third and fourth season, despite HBO not renewing it past season 2 yet. Mazin emphasized that they can't fit the entire story into two or three seasons, so Season 3 will be significantly longer. One episode is expected to be quite long, but not feature-length.
