It's essential to note that these alerts are just a guideline, and harsh driving conditions may necessitate more frequent maintenance. For those who want extra peace of mind, Honda offers extended service contracts called Honda Care Vehicle Service, which combine regular maintenance with comprehensive coverage for additional components. These plans can be purchased from dealerships and cover vehicles for up to 8 years or 120,000 miles, regardless of the make. Regularly checking your Honda's maintenance needs with the help of the Maintenance Minder system ensures smooth operation and cost-effectiveness over time. This system monitors various aspects of your vehicle, sending alerts when servicing or replacement is necessary to maintain its health and longevity. It works by using sensors to estimate engine oil life based on factors such as speed, temperature, and driving conditions. When the remaining oil life reaches 15%, the system sends a dashboard alert for an impending service. Additionally, it monitors other components like oil filters, tires, brakes, and fluids, alerting you when replacement or servicing is due.
