This is an extension of MILPER 23-004 until changes to the MPLP are reflected in AR 600-8-10. 3. Various Army regulations and directives cover topics such as planning, programming, budgeting, and execution, while house liaison and communications, funding within the Department Of The Army, civilian aides to the secretary of the army, and many others. Army Regulations for Various Departments and Programs The Army has established numerous regulations to govern various aspects of its operations. These regulations include Army Telecommunications and Unified Capabilities (AR 25-13), the Privacy and Civil Liberties Program (AR 25-22), and the Army Publishing Program (AR 25-30). Additionally, there are regulations for joint technical coordinating groups, such as the Joint Technical Coordinating Group for Munitions Effectiveness (JTCG/ME) publications. In addition to these regulations, the Army has guidelines for various other programs, such as the Army Records Management Program (AR 25-400-2), the Information Management Control Requirements Program (AR 25-98), and the Department of Defense Foreign Tax Relief Program (AR 27-70). The management of land and facilities for the Army Reserve is also covered by AR 140-483. Regulations on chaplain corps activities, motor vehicle traffic supervision, obtaining information from financial institutions, and biological select agents security are scattered throughout various sections of the regulations. Finally, regulations addressing military working dog programs, physical security protocols, corrections systems, and contingency funding for criminal investigations provide further guidance on supporting operational readiness and law enforcement capabilities within the Army Reserve.
