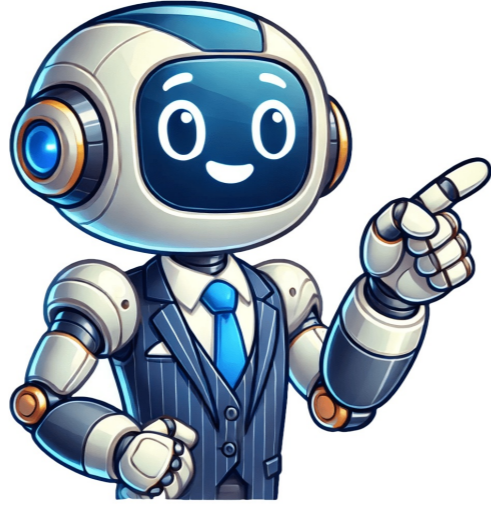


I'm not a robot



Current imagery automatically displays in Google Earth. To discover how images have changed over time or view past versions of a map on a timeline: On your device, open Google Earth. Search for places. To view a map over time, you can either: In the toolbar, click Historical imagery . Click View Historical Imagery. This feature isnt available if youre using the Map basemap. To enable this feature, change your basemap to Satellite. Select how you want to view the map. To turn on historical imagery view, at the top left, click Historical imagery . To turn on timelapse, at the top left, click Timelapse . A timeline appears. At the top right, click the timeline to explore the map over time. To find a specific time, you can either: Click the year you want to view in the timeline. Click Previous or Next. To lock the latest imagery, click Last page. To minimize the historical imagery toolbar, at the top right, click Collapse. At the top left, the toolbar remains active as a floating chip. To deactivate historical imagery, click Historical imagery. Tips: To optimize your viewing experience, 3D buildings feature is turned off when historical imagery is turned on. Satellite image availability is represented on the slider. Image availability may change as you explore. Years are marked by dots. Smaller dots indicate additional months. If a previously selected year becomes unavailable, its dot on the slider turns gray. Global coverage varies. A CAPTCHA is a turing test to tell human and bots apart. It is easy for humans to solve, but hard for bots and other malicious software to figure out. By adding reCAPTCHA to a site, you can block automated software while helping your welcome users to enter with ease. Try it out at . Youve passed our robot test (yes, its that easy). You can carry on with what you were doing. Sometimes we need some extra info from you to make sure youre human and not a robot, so we ask you to solve a challenge: Simply follow the on-screen instructions to solve the puzzle and then carry on with your task. reCAPTCHA works with major screen readers such as ChromeVox (Chrome OS), JAWS (IE/Edge/Chrome on Windows), NVDA (IE/Edge/Chrome on Windows) and VoiceOver (Safari/Chrome on Mac OS). reCAPTCHA will alert screen readers of status changes, such as when the reCAPTCHA verification challenge is complete. The status can also be found by looking for the heading titled recaptcha status in the recaptcha widget section of the page. See reCAPTCHA ARIA Status Messages for more information. Please use the following steps to solve an audio challenge: If you are presented with a visual challenge, locate and click on the button. You will be presented with one of two versions of the audio challenge depending on whether youre using a mobile device. Press PLAY and enter the numbers you hear in the text input box located after the PLAY button or audio control. If your focus isnt automatically set on the text input box after pressing the PLAY button, tab to proceed to it. When youre done entering the numbers from the audio, press ENTER or click on the Verify button to submit your answer. If your answer is incorrect, you will be presented with another audio challenge. If your answer is correct, the audio challenge will close and the reCAPTCHA checkbox will become checked. ReCAPTCHA will also notify the screen reader of the successful verification. Please note that the verification will expire after some time and you will need to start over if this occurs. You will be notified if the verification expires. Tips If the audio doesnt play, try downloading the audio by locating and clicking on the link. While in the text input box, you can press the R button to replay the audio from the beginning To get a different audio challenge, locate and press the button. The reCAPTCHA verification expires after a certain amount of time so it is best to complete the reCAPTCHA verification last on a website you are accessing. Information shown on the "Activity on this account" page The "Activity on this account" page shows your sign-in records, and includes the information below. Concurrent session information In the "Concurrent session information" section, you'll see if you're signed in to Gmail on another device, browser, or location. Access type In the "Access type" section, you'll see the browser, device, or mail server (like POP or IMAP) that you accessed Gmail from. If you've authorized an application, you'll see the location (IP Address) of the 3rd party application. Location (IP address) You can see the last 10 IP addresses and approximate locations that accessed your Gmail account. If you got a warning about suspicious activity in your account, you might also see up to 3 additional IP addresses that have been labeled as suspicious. There are a few reasons you may see multiple IP addresses or locations in your activity: If you use POP or IMAP to read your mail on other services, like Apple Mail or Microsoft Outlook, this location information will be included, too. If you use Mail Fetcher, a Google IP will show up because your messages are being fetched through a Google server. If you use Gmail on a phone or tablet, your Internet service or mobile carrier's location may show up. This may be a location far from where you are. As long as the name of the carrier matches yours, this isn't unusual. Post to the help community Get answers from community members If you forgot your password or username, or you cant get verification codes, follow these steps to recover your Google Account. That way, you can use services like Gmail, Photos, and Google Play. Tips: Wrong guesses wont kick you out of the account recovery process. There's no limit to the number of times you can attempt to recover your account. If you use an account through your work, school, or other group, these steps might not work. Check with your administrator for help. To recover an account for a child under 13(or the applicable age in your country) you can reset your child's password. Find or delete your child's saved activity Important: If you added supervision to your childs previously existing Google Account, youll need their help to do this. On your child's device, visit the My Activity page. Search for the app you want to find activity for. To find your childs activity, tap Details. To remove your childs activity, tap Delete. Change your child's name, birthday, or gender Open the Family Link app . Select your child. Tap Controls Account settings. To change your childs information: Tap Name Tap Birthday Tap Gender Based on the updated information, tap Done or Ok. Change your child's photo Important: This option isnt available if you added supervision after your childs Google Account was created. Open the Family Link app . Select your child. Tap Controls Account Settings Change photo. To change your childs photo, you can select: Tip: To remove your childs photo, tap Remove. Reset your child's password If you change your childs password, they get signed out from their devices. Any supervision settings you turned on wont work until your child signs in again. Open the Family Link app . Select your child. Tap Controls Account settings Change password. Sign in with your Google Account information. Enter a new password. Tap Change. If your child has 2-Step Verification turned on, to confirm the pop-up notification, tap Got it. Tips: Whether or not your child can control their own account settings doesnt change the settings themselves. Its recommended for parents to make sure the settings are correct after they change this control. You can also manage these settings from g.co/YourFamily. 2-StepVerification for your child's account If your child has 2-Step Verification turned on for their account and you change their password, 2-Step Verification gets turned off. After 2-Step Verification is turned off, a notification email is sent to both you and your child. Your child can turn on 2-Step Verification again once they sign in to their account.
