However, some users find it a bit bulky. Its ergonomic design provides significant back support, making it an excellent choice for long periods of wear. In comparison to other baby carriers, such as the Ergobaby Omni Breeze, the Lillebaby Complete is a more affordable option at \$100 (compared to \$200 during non-sale periods). However, its bulkier construction may make it less suitable for travelers or those who prioritize compactness. The author, a seasoned hiker with two young children in tow, has put the Lillebaby Complete All Seasons 6-in-1 Baby Carrier to the test. With a 3-year-old son and a 6-month-old daughter who have been accompanying them on hikes for their entire lives, the family's needs are varied and demanding. The author praises this baby carrier as the best value in their larger review of top carriers, highlighting its exceptional comfort, support, and versatility. A budget-friendly option, the Lillebaby Complete All Seasons is perfect for those who don't plan to use their baby carrier daily or have limited financial resources. Despite its affordable price tag, this carrier outperforms many pricier competitors in terms of quality, comfort, and features. The only drawback mentioned is that the carrier is a bit stiff, which is offset by its impressive padding and support systems. The author, who initially found the padding to be annoying, soon realized it allowed for extended wear without straining their lower back. This feature alone makes the Lillebaby Complete All Seasons an excellent choice. Lillebaby is a top contender among baby carriers, but it has its drawbacks. The padding is substantial, which makes carrying heavy babies tolerable, but some users found the inward front-carry options less appealing once their child turned or switched to back-carry mode. This might be due to seat width and needed adjustments as kids grow. On the other hand, Lil'baby's belt extender allows for a broader range of body types, expanding the hip belt up to 61.5 inches - more than Ergobaby. One major compromise with the budget cuts is in materials; buckles are sturdier but harder to open and close due to cheaper plastic, while straps get tighter because fabric isn't as smooth. The cotton gets dirty easily and takes almost two days to air-dry due to thick padding. A privacy hood on the front has a zip pocket that's nice for sleep but made from lower-quality material than Ergobaby Omni Breeze. Also, feeding on-the-go is challenging with this carrier. Comparing it to other carriers, Lil'baby Complete isn't as high-end as top pick Ergobaby Omni Breeze due to breathable mesh and polyester materials. The cotton takes longer to dry and is less breathable, making it hot during summer months. However, the bulkier design comes with added comfort and padding that both my daughter and I loved. Lil'baby is very ergonomic, distributing weight evenly for comfortable wear even in long periods. While Ergobaby Omni Breeze might be a better choice for older babies or toddlers due to its wider range of motion and flexibility, Lil'baby's lower price (\$100) makes it more economical, especially considering the exceptional support and comfort it offers. The Lillebaby carrier is pretty standard - its weight limit spans from 7 to 45 pounds (3.2 to 20 kg), with most parents finding it suitable for their little ones right after birth or up until they're in preschool, you can machine wash it, just be sure to use cold water and some gentle baby soap so as not to damage the fabric. The Lillebaby All Seasons baby carrier is a versatile option that offers several carrying positions, including two for infants and four for babies six months and older. Its unique feature is the adjustable hood, which can be pulled out of one of the pockets or stored away when not in use. The shoulder straps are thicker than most alternatives, providing excellent comfort and support. While the fetal position may seem ideal for newborns, it is not recommended by the International Hip Dysplasia Institute due to potential hip dysplasia risks. The pocket and hood work well individually but can be less effective together due to storage space constraints. Furthermore, transitioning your baby from an inward-facing to outward-facing position can be complicated. During testing, some issues were discovered, including the shoulder straps digging into the armpit and the cross straps being difficult to adjust. The waist straps felt stiff, which may cause discomfort for parents. Overall, while the Lillebaby All Seasons is a solid baby carrier, it falls short in terms of usability and comfort compared to other options. The carrier's cotton fabric gets dirty and wet pretty easy, too. I washed this carrier in the washing machine, and it took almost two days to air-dry because the padding is so thick. The Lillebaby has a zip pocket on the front that holds a privacy hood; this is nice for sleep, but the hood is made with lower-quality material than the privacy hood on my top pick, the Ergobaby Omni Breeze. The carrier also isn't flexible enough to allow for feeding on the go. And that pocket can't hold many items without disrupting your child (because the pocket lies along the child's back or stomach, depending on positioning, and rigid items will poke them). The pocket's zipper also gets stuck more often than not. These two were the best baby carriers but they offer a few key differences. The cotton materials aren't as easy to clean as the mesh and polyester of the Omni Breeze, and they take longer to dry. The Lillebaby Complete is also not as breathable, which means it may be hot, especially during the summer months. And the carrier itself is significantly bulkier than the Omni Breeze; it wouldn't pack well into a suitcase. But with that bulk comes added comfort and padding, which my daughter and I both loved. The Lillebaby is also very ergonomic, with significant back padding and a very wide hip belt—even more so than the Omni Breeze, which is saying something. The weight was so evenly distributed with this carrier that I could have worn my daughter for hours, and she fell asleep every time I put her into it. If you plan to carry a toddler or older baby, you'll likely want to opt for the Ergobaby Omni Breeze over the Lillebaby Complete. Forward facing never really worked for me because I'm petite and large-chested. If they want to see out, my babies seem to like the back carry position. If you're using the Lillebaby from birth, you'll be starting with a wide seat front carry. Your newborn's legs will be inside the carrier in an M position. When your infant is a little more developed, you'll adjust the carrier to the narrow seat for a front carry. With your infant facing you with their legs out, they will enjoy a little more freedom and still be able to cuddle close. While not an official Lillebaby position, there is a position known as scrunch seat for babies who need a little more support than the narrow seat but aren't quite big enough for wide seat. Prepare to use the wide seat, but don't button the snaps down. Instead, scrunch the sides in a bit for a custom fit from knee to knee. After your baby has grown a bit more, and their legs begin to hang down, you'll want to adjust back to the wide seat. The toddler front carry gives your baby the ability to interact with you while still being held close by the carrier. Once your baby is ready, you can begin using the Lillebaby for back carries. This gives them a similar view of the world as forward facing, while being a little more hands-free for the wearer. Your baby will be securely strapped in with their legs out and a wide seat to support them. This carry position allows you to have both arms free while still keeping your little one close. Feel free to use the lumbar support on your belly to displace the weight of the waistband. For older babies, an outward-facing carry is a great option when your baby wants to observe their surroundings. Babies usually love this position or hate it. Only use this carry after your little one can support their head and neck without assistance and be sure to only use the narrow seat while outward facing. When your baby is ready, you can try a side carry or hip carry. This is an especially great way to wear an older baby or toddler – allowing them to have one side of the body free to explore their surroundings. Another great feature of the Lillebaby Complete carrier is that it is machine washable. Lillebaby recommends washing it with cold water and hanging it to dry. I place my carriers in a mesh bag and wash on a gentle cycle or hand wash cycle. The Lillebaby Complete dries and the straps hold up very well due to the fabric's texture. The cotton fabric is prone to getting dirty and wet quickly, which can make cleaning more challenging. I bought this carrier during pregnancy and used it extensively until COVID hit when my daughter was just two years old due to lockdowns. Although we didn't leave much, I'm confident that using the hip carry option would have been great if circumstances allowed. The Lillebaby All Seasons has a zip-down mesh panel for extra airflow in hot climates, and an Airflow carrier with only mesh is perfect for extreme heat. However, I prefer this model because it's versatile and suitable for my environment, which can range from very hot to cold. This carrier features a large bucket seat and hip stable design, making it extremely comfortable for babies. The wide adjustable shoulder straps, waistband, and lumbar support are also very comfortable for wearers. Crossable shoulder straps make it perfect for petite people as well. I've worn this carrier on many full-day adventures without any issues. I purchased this carrier in 2018 and used it constantly for two years without any problems. It's withstood heavy use, including mud, strollers, cars, and sharing with friends, and remains in great condition. One minor drawback of the Lillebaby is its transition method between outward and inward-facing - you need to remove the lumbar support to change configurations. The LILLEbaby has a good range of child sizes available, from 7 pounds to 45 pounds, making it suitable for both newborns and older children. The waistband adjusts to accommodate different sizes and extends up to 52 inches, with an optional waist belt extender that can increase the fit to 61.5 inches. The carrier's design quality is also noteworthy, with a focus on security and support features. The lumbar support piece provides excellent back support for the wearer, and the two adjustable straps on the head support piece offer stability for babies who need extra support. The LILLEbaby Comfort Carrier offers good comfort to its wearer through its lumbar support piece and padded shoulder straps. Although the straps felt bulky, they provided better weight distribution compared to other carriers, reducing pressure on the hips and waist. The thick, well-padded material can become warm in hot weather, but the breathable mesh inside helps mitigate this issue. A unique feature of this carrier is its ability to keep baby's legs in the ergonomic "M" position, ensuring comfort for test subjects.
